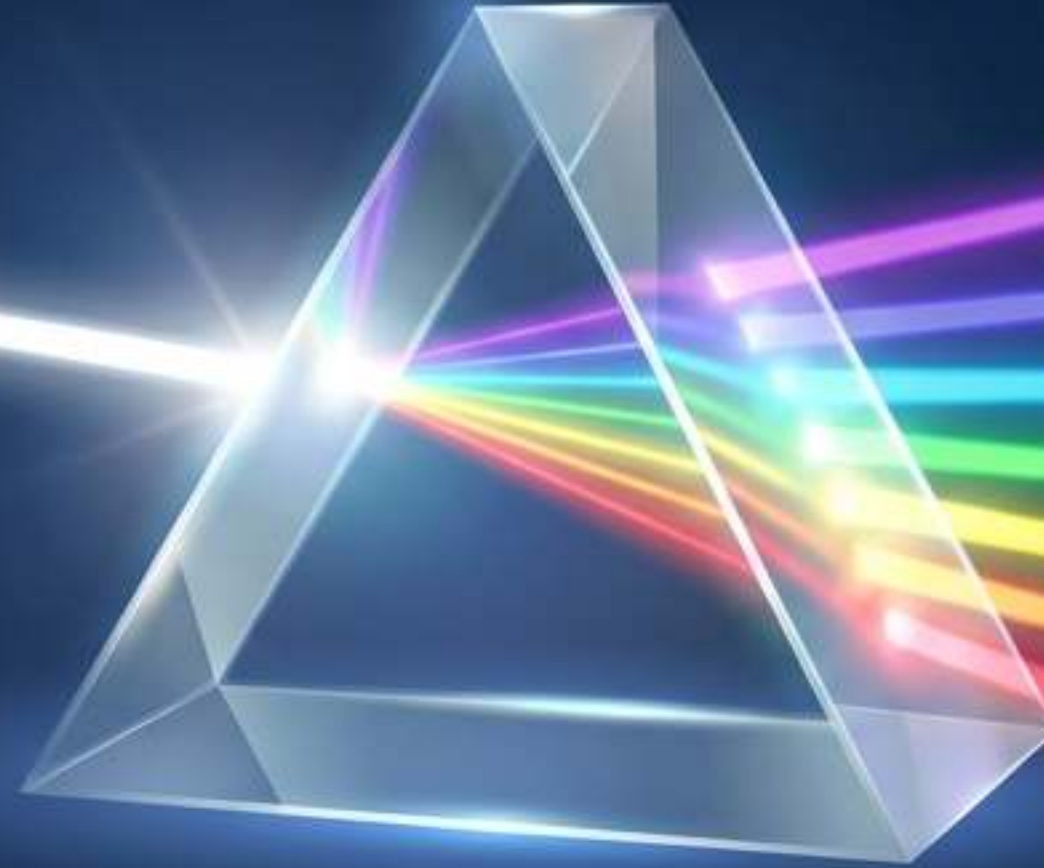

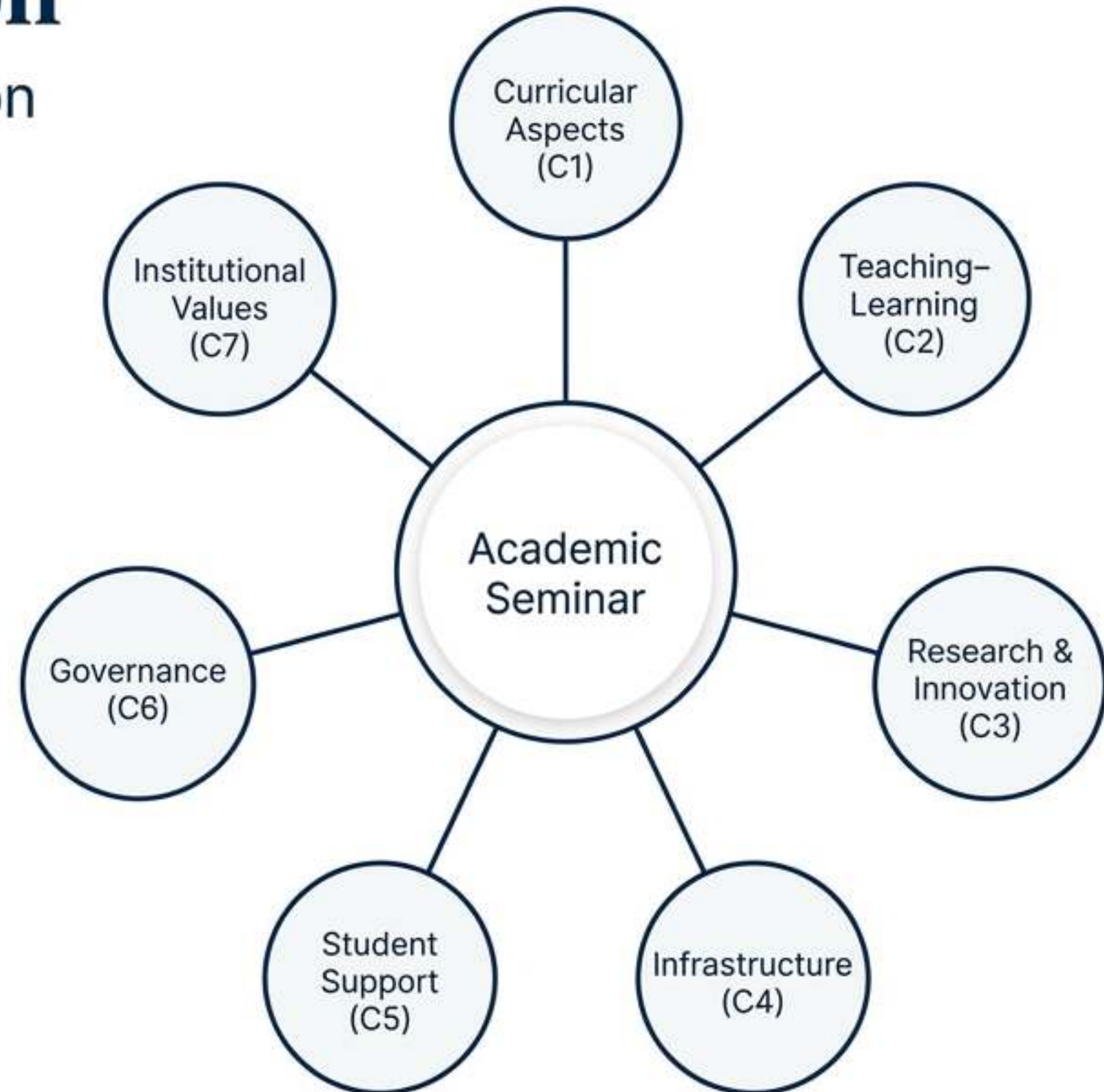

The 7-Point Connection

A holistic approach to documentation and impact analysis.



The Learning Experience: Curriculum & Pedagogy

Criterion 1 (Curricular Aspects)

- **Contribution:** Themes aligned with syllabus; exposure to interdisciplinary areas.
- **Metrics:** Curriculum enrichment; value-added courses.

Criterion 2 (Teaching–Learning)

- **Contribution:** Expert lectures; interactive Q&A sessions; feedback-based evaluation.
- **Metrics:** Teaching-learning innovations; student engagement.

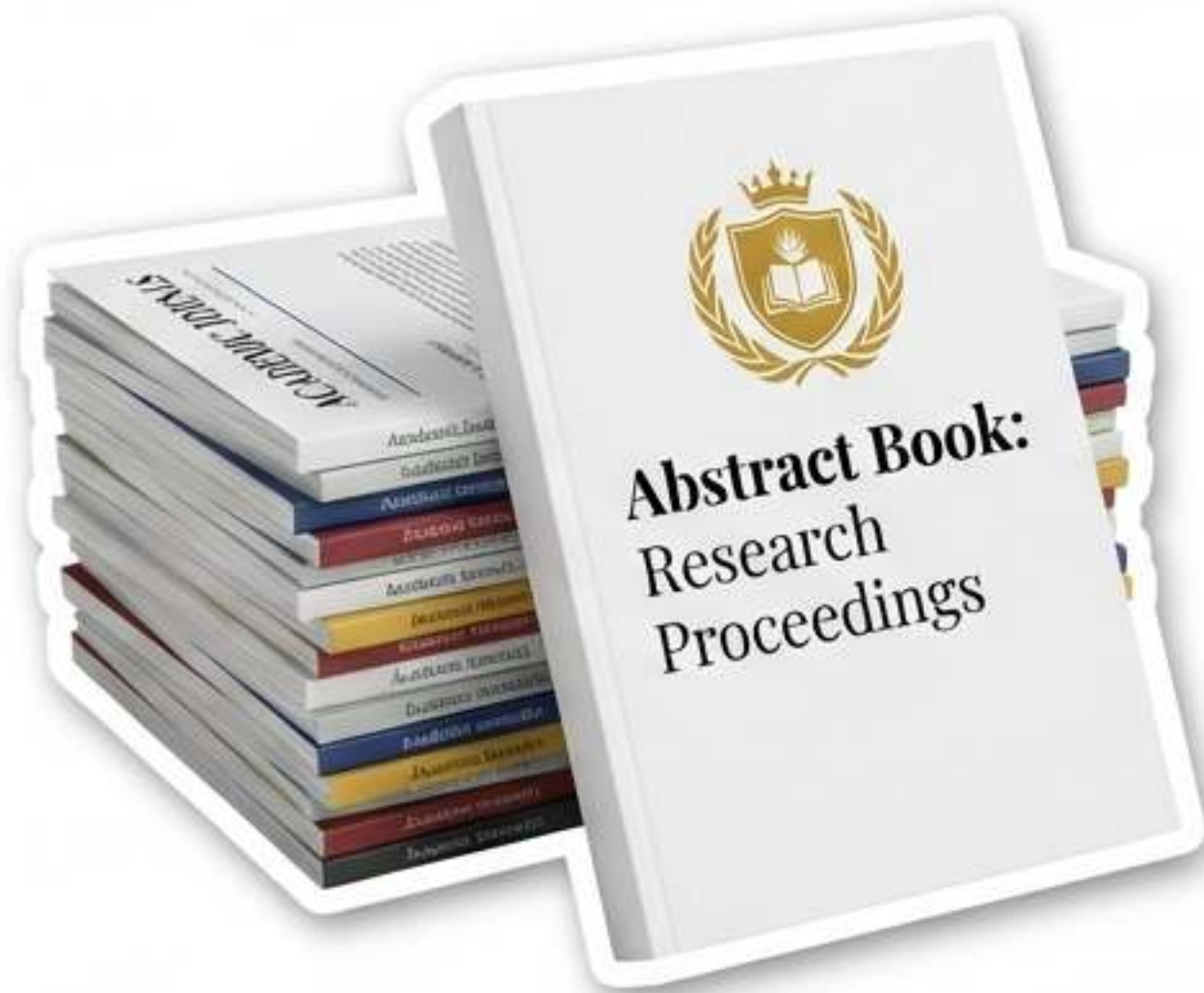

The Research Ecosystem: Innovation & Dissemination

Criterion 3 (Research, Innovations, and Extension)



- **Platform** for research paper presentations.
- **Publication** of proceedings or abstract books.
- **Promotion** of research orientation among students and faculty.
- **Academic networking** and research discussions.
- **Crimurt** or research proceedings.



Evidence Required

- Paper presentation list
- Seminar proceedings booklet/Abstracts
- Outcome and impact report

NAAC Metrics: Research promotion activities;
Dissemination of research output.

Infrastructure & Resources: Optimization

Criterion 4 (Infrastructure and Learning Resources)

Key Contributions:

- Optimal use of seminar halls and ICT tools.
- Execution of online or hybrid formats.
- **NAAC Metrics:** ICT-enabled teaching-learning; Optimal utilization of infrastructure.

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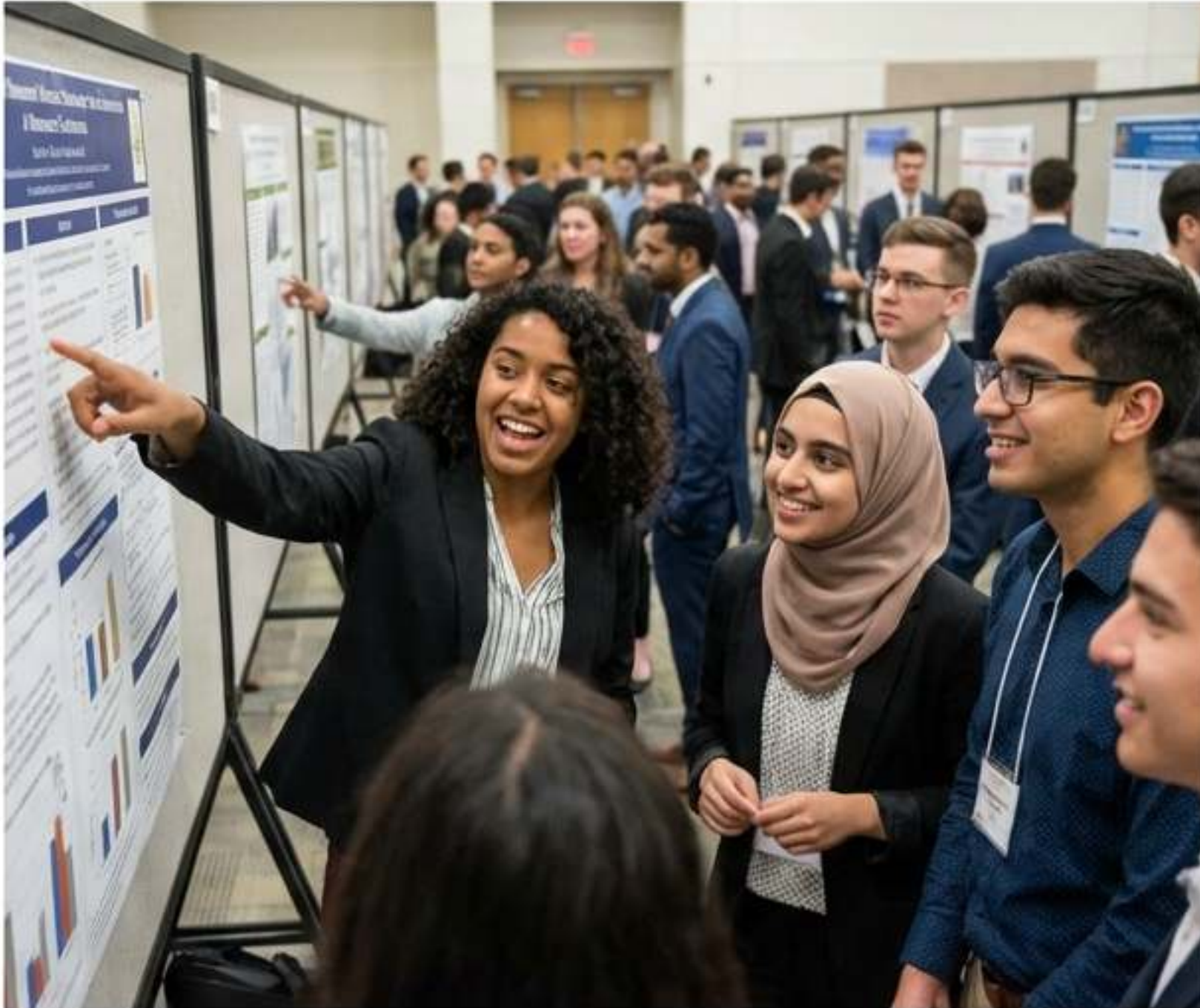


Evidence Required

- Photographs of seminar hall and ICT usage
- Online platform screenshots
- Event-day videos

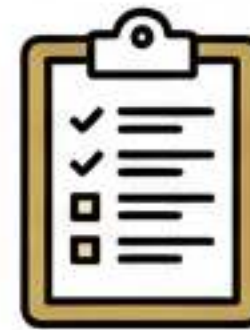
Student Success: Support & Progression

Criterion 5 (Student Support and Progression)



Key Contributions:

- Active participation as attendees, presenters, and volunteers.
- Exposure to career orientation and academic trends.
- Formal certification and recognition of skills.
- NAAC Metrics: Student support activities; Skill development.



Evidence Required

- Student attendance sheets
- Certificates issued
- Student feedback forms
- Participation statistics

Governance & Institutional Values

Criterion 6 (Governance, Leadership, Management)

Contribution:

- Committee-based planning; IQAC monitoring; Transparent financial management.



Evidence Required

- Approval orders
- Budget sanction notes
- Audited financial statements
- IQAC remarks

Criterion 7 (Institutional Values & Best Practices)

Contribution:

- Inclusive participation; Ethical academic practices; Defining institutional distinctiveness.



Evidence Required

- Best practice narrative
- NAAC-compliant seminar report
- Peer team summary

Academic Quality

- Use one strong seminar to support multiple criteria.
- Maintain clear cross-referencing in your documentation.

 **Action Item:** Keep a “criterion-wise mapping sheet” at the very front of the seminar file.
